## KS2 Learning Programme

The IBCC provides a world-class facility acknowledging the efforts, sacrifices and commitment of the men and women, from 62 different nations, who came together in Bomber Command during WWII, as well as the stories of those who suffered because of the bombing campaigns and those whose survival was guaranteed by the humanitarian operations of Bomber Command.

Enhance your students studies of the Second World War or Local History with a visit to the IBCC. Our facilitated schools' sessions will enable your students to develop their skills in historical enquiry by discovering first hand stories, unique artefacts and state of the art interactives.

**TIMINGS:** Fully facilitated school visits start at 10am and finish at 2pm with a 15 minute snack break and a 45-minute break for lunch. A fully facilitated visit comprises of one workshop with the Learning Officer, as well as a tour of The Spire and Exhibition.



### Secrets and Spies: Morse Code in the Second World War

Transport your class back to the Second World War, as they try their hand at Morse Code and learn about the different ways it was used during the war.

Subjects: History (WW2) Science (communications)



### Their Story, Our History: Object Handling

In this hands-on session your pupils are able to handle authentic artefacts relating to Bomber Command and the Second World War, as well as do a bit of dressing up!

Subjects: History (WW2, Women at War, POWs, Children in Wartime)
